

SIXTH FORM TRIP TO GAMBIA FEBRUARY 2018

As you may be aware, for many years the Academy has supported a village in The Gambia, West Africa. We are again organising to take a group of Sixth Form pupils to Penyem, Gambia, during the holiday in February 2018. This is an amazing lifetime opportunity to visit a lower income country and see the local people living their daily lives. Pupils will see the running of the school, medical centre, solar farm and experience how people go about their everyday lives, with the chance to help cooking, wash, and collect the vegetables and grain.

Planning for the trip is in the early stages, with places limited to 15 pupils, allocated on a 'first-come first-served' basis. Mrs Commons (Head of Geography), Mr Robertson (Head of Sixth form) and Miss E Carroll (Humanities) will be taking part in the trip, and it is likely that additional staff may also take up this wonderful chance to visit The Gambia. The cost of flights and bed and breakfast hotel accommodation, airport transfers in The Gambia, transport to the village, insurance etc will be approximately £950-£1000 per pupil. A non returnable deposit of £200 is required, with the balance to be paid by the October 2017 holiday.

SPREAD A LITTLE KINDESSS CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WEEK

The week from 6 – 10 February 2017 was Children's Mental Health Week and the Academy spent the week with dedicated assemblies and specific form time activities based on the mental health of our pupils. As part of our 'celebration' of this issue we were involved in 'Challenge Tessa'. Tessa Parkinson (from the Mental Health Stigma Programme) met Year 7 pupils on Thursday 9 February



dressed in a white jumpsuit and bearing balloons and leaflets for our pupils to read. Tessa's aim was to visit as many schools and Academies in Northamptonshire as possible who would stamp her suit with their name to raise awareness of this important issue. Sam Rattigan stamped her suit and we discussed the concept of "stigma" in relation to Mental Health in order to get pupils thinking and talking about mental health and the difficulties people face when dealing with problems in their lives. The pupils had their photograph taken with Tessa at the front of Academy.

On Friday 10 February, 50 balloons were released from the front of the Academy sending a message to everyone that schools and Academies in Northamptonshire are working to support the mental health of all our pupils. To show Kingswood's commitment within the community we set ourselves the challenge of making 1000 paper cranes (a Japanese legend that grants the maker a wish if they make 1000) to be displayed in Reception. By 3:10pm on Friday 10 February pupils and staff had made an unbelievable 1143 cranes, with more arriving. This will form a stunning visual representation and send a clear message that as an Academy we will help and support anyone with a mental health concern or issue.









EMERGENCY CADETS

We are delighted to announce the start of the Kingswood Emergency Cadets in April. This will give pupils the opportunity to be trained by members of the Police, Fire and Ambulance Service for 10 week modules.

The training will require pupils to work at the Police Station and Fire Station, and to understand how all the Emergency Services work together. This will be a truly exciting opportunity and it could culminate in gaining a recognised qualification in Leadership and

Teamwork. The initiative will launch at our Academy which will be the first for Corby! Training will take place each week on a Thursday and all participants will be issued with uniforms that can be worn during the Academy day when training is scheduled.

It is open to pupils in Year 9 and above. If you are interested in joining then please see your Year Team or alternatively see Mr Van Lier in the Atrium any day during Break 2.



KNIFE CRIME

This week (1 and 2 March), Year 9 and 10 assemblies were organised and run by The Northants Police Force, tackling issues such as knife crime, safety and gangs. PCSO Steve Coles was accompanied by Laura Shaw delivering a mixture of information, interactive work and video footage to cover all of these areas. The videos were of good quality and showed how a 17 year old had become involved in a gang set up that led to him putting himself and his family in grave danger. Another story was how a young 13 year old girl also become involved with a gang who used and then also abused her and forced her to carry out hideous crimes. She was detained at the end of her story. All in all the videos were very informative and quite hard hitting without being graphic.



The message centred around being sensible and staying safe. Pupils were also given details of an organisation approachable by either email or leaving messages anonymously, if they see or hear anything or anyone who is at risk, themselves included.

The feedback afterwards from pupils was very positive and the sessions were very well received.

HOW TO BE FOOD SMART

As part of a project being run with the Youth Sport Trust (PE2020 project), we are a trailblazing Academy with a group of pupils from Year 7 to Year 13 who are health and wellbeing champions. Deirdre Harrington who is based at the Leicester General Hospital.

As part of this project, we spent the day at Leicester Diabetes Centre with Dr

The Health and Wellbeing Champions have now designed a programme and delivered this to all Year 7 pupils in form time. This included increasing awareness by playing diabetes bingo whilst watching a video clip, playing

diabetes truth or false, and then making the pupils sugar smart by measuring the sugar content in drinks.

The project has been so successful we are looking at now rolling it out to Year 8 pupils.
