INSTAGRAM AND MUSICAL.LY

Just a reminder that when using the above apps it is not too difficult to find yourself directed to inappropriate images including pornography through hashtag links and you don't always need internet access.

A recent survey by the NSPCC highlighted more than a third of 13-14 year olds who have seen online porn want to copy some of the behaviour they have seen. Once again, the big worry is parents are not fully aware of how easy it is.

POKEMON GO

Well, that craze lasted a long time downloads of the app have dropped off since July. Remember the basics of online safety folks. To an extent it does not matter where young people go online we must keep talking to young people about not talking to strangers, not meeting strangers and not giving out personal information.

QUICK TIP!

When online always look out for:

Will help delete, block or report something online especially or social media.

Will take you to your settings even on your phone

Means it's a secure website. You will spot it next to the address bar. Always look out for the padlock

NET AWARE APP

This is an amazing app that is free to download. It is aimed at parents and allows you to see some of the popular areas young people go online and provides short and snappy advice about safety on a

number of apps and online games. You will find it within the various app stores. Look out for the logo.

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What is sexting?

Sexting is when someone shares sexual, naked or semi-naked images or videos of themselves or others, or sends sexually explicit messages.

They can be sent using mobiles, tablets, smartphones, laptops - any device that allows you to share media and messages. Sexting may also be called: 'Trading Nudes', 'Dirties' or 'Pic for Pic'

The law says: sexting can be seen as harmless, but creating or sharing explicit images of a child is illegal, even if the person doing it is a child. A young person is breaking the law if they:

- take an explicit photo or video of themselves or a friend
- share an explicit image or video of a child, even if it's shared between children of the same age
- possess, download or store an explicit image or video of a child, even if the child gave their permission for it to be created.

However, as of January 2016 in England and Wales, if a young person is found creating or sharing images, the police can choose to record that a crime has been committed but that taking formal action isn't in the public interest.
