This involved the whole year group and was a very intense, sometimes upsetting, but ultimately very rewarding day. Through role play, group work, teamwork and individual confidence building they helped pupils to understand and confront a range of issues. The leader, Steve, is highly skilled at working with large groups of pupils and is very engaging. The pupils and staff involved found it highly intensive work, but ultimately a very heart-warming and rewarding day.

Hopefully, these experiences will help the pupils to be more aware of and understand problems and issues which were worked through. Year 8 were fantastic – as were the Humanutopia team.

- People might not always be what they seem
- Spam or junk emails may hold viruses that could harm your computer

- Never give out any personal details to anyone you meet whilst on the Internet
- Never agree to meet up with anyone you don't already know
- Never reply to any spam or junk emails that you have received
- Do not accept friend requests or reply to emails or messages from people you don't know
- Do not post or send offensive messages, emails or pictures
- When downloading files make sure they are from a trusted source and only do so with permission
- Do not share your usernames and passwords

Vivo is the reward scheme used here at Kingswood Secondary Academy. Pupils are awarded points for a range of positive reasons including:

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Pupils can build up their Vivo points and exchange them for a huge choice of gifts from the online vShop and can also opt for other rewards such as a queue jump pass for the Academy canteen or they can turn their points into a donation to charity.
