#### WALES OUTWARD BOUND TRIP

On Monday 12 October a group of pupils took part in a five-day outward bound course in West Wales to participate in outdoor activities designed to develop self-confidence, social skills and to experience new challenges. The pupils were really looking forward to their trip. For many, it was the first time they had been away without their parents. Joining us on the bus were pupils from the Weston Favell Academy and, initially, there was little interaction between the pupils. However, they all soon became friends.



Shortly after arrival all pupils were expected to complete the 'run and

dip', which consisted of a one mile jog followed by fully submersing themselves into the sea. There was the usual 'I'm not doing that' response, but I am proud to say that after encouragement by the instructors they all completed the tasks and were very proud of themselves, as they had pushed well beyond any previous boundaries.



Throughout the trip there were plenty of tests of stamina and courage. All the pupils were asked to jump off Aberdovey Pier straight into the sea. Even non swimmers took part and this proved a great success. Again the instructors were proactive and led from the front. Others were asked to complete the commando crawl, this is where a rope is strung out between two points, again across the very cold sea, with the pupils being required to lay on the rope and pull themselves across. The star of this show was Anthony O'Gormley who managed the most spectacular dismount of all the youngsters, completing a full 360 degree spin en route to the sea.

Other points of note were the 'death jump' where they were required to climb a 30ft pole, stand on the very top, leap towards the trapeze bar and catch it. There is a rumour that

Another day was spent kayaking on the open sea and this proved very difficult for some. One young lady managed to go round in circles for about an hour until the offer of a tow was given as the tide was rapidly going out. This was a great day out and all enjoyed it.



I am happy to say that the pupils had a great time, behaviour was good, and their morale and 'can do' attitude really shone through. Lasting friendships were made and they learned a lot about themselves in this short period of time.

All in all, this was an excellent trip and it has to be said that the Outward Bound Staff were absolutely excellent and managed the pupils with great professionalism.
