This opens up into a bag for life and will sell for £2.50. We believe our handy bag to be trendy and our message to you is to 'shop in style'. We decided to produce this type of product due to the new law set on 5 October 2015 which, as you are now all aware, means shops have to charge 5p to purchase a plastic bag.

Our re-useable jars come in different shapes and sizes: small (£3), medium (£3.50) and large (£4.00). Each jar is sold with sweets inside. When purchasing a jar, you will be given one of our handmade craft jar booklets. This involves a variety of ideas to re-create your jar after your purchase, for example: turning your sweetie jar into a revision jar, savings jar, memory jar, or whatever you choose!

We have previously sold these products at different trade fares in Wellingborough (where we won the best product award), Corby town centre and our Academy's Christmas Fare. More recently, we visited Milton Keynes Shopping Centre to take part in a competition to show off our business skills among 53 other schools/companies across the UK.
