As part of this process, as with all inspections, Ofsted seeks the views of Parents and Carers. The inspector was very clear in his feedback to me that the community feel here is unique, so again I thank you and our staff and students for this collaboration. It is through this shared partnership that our students have the very best opportunity to thrive and achieve their best. We are extremely proud of the Ofsted report and the Parent and Carer survey results. Some of the key headlines from the survey are:

96%: My child feels safe at school;

95%: The school has high expectations of my child;

93%: My Child is happy at school;

92%: My child does well at this school;

91%: The school makes sure its pupils are well-behaved;

91%: I would recommend this school to another parent.

I am delighted to share some fantastic news following our recent Ofsted inspection, which took place on 18 and 19 March 2025. The final report has now been published on the Ofsted website, and we are incredibly proud of the outcome and the many significant strengths highlighted by inspectors.

The opening paragraph of the report is a powerful reflection of the Academy. It recognises the strong sense of ambition and inclusivity that runs throughout our school and the continual hard work and dedication of our staff to ensure all of our students have the very best opportunity to reach their full potential and thrive. The report notes:

"Ambition and high expectations underpin the positive and inclusive culture at Kingswood Secondary Academy. Staff prioritise raising aspirations and reducing barriers so that all pupils can be successful."

I was pleased that Inspectors commented on the respectful, safe and calm environment here at Kingswood. This is part of our fundamental culture based on our RISE values of Respect, Independence, Service to the Community and Empathy. Inspectors highlighted that:

"Pupils get along well together during social times and move around the school calmly." "In lessons, pupils display positive attitudes and try hard. Pupils feel safe and are well cared for."

Kingswood is an inclusive Academy, and we work tirelessly to ensure that all of our pupils can reach their full potential. We are therefore particularly pleased that Ofsted not only referenced how staff prioritised raising aspirations and reducing barriers so all pupils can be successful, but further highlighted the exceptional support provided for pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND):

"The school provides excellent support for pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND). It quickly identifies when pupils have SEND. Detailed information is shared with staff so that they can adapt learning activities, when necessary."

At Kingswood we believe in developing the whole child, and the report importantly acknowledged the strength of the extra-curricular and personal development we offer, which plays a vital role in our pupils' wider growth:

"The school provides a variety of extra-curricular activities to support pupils' wider development. Clubs develop pupils' talents in sport and the arts. Further opportunities include the Duke of Edinburgh's Award scheme and the Emergency Services Cadets group."

"Pupils benefit from an excellent careers programme that includes personalised advice about next steps for all pupils and pupils in the Sixth Form."

We are very proud of our pupils, our staff, and the support we receive from our families and wider community. While the report praises all aspects of life at Kingswood, I assure you that we continue to be committed to our development to ensure that Kingswood continues to further improve and thrive in the future. We will particularly focus, as identified in the report, on how we check pupils' understanding and how feedback is provided in lessons.

This report reflects the hard work, dedication, and shared values that make Kingswood Secondary Academy the school it is, where all pupils are encouraged to reach their full potential, to have high aspirations and to become valued members of society.

At Kingswood we recognise and celebrate positive behaviour and encourage children to attend school by rewarding them with a wide range of prizes, including:

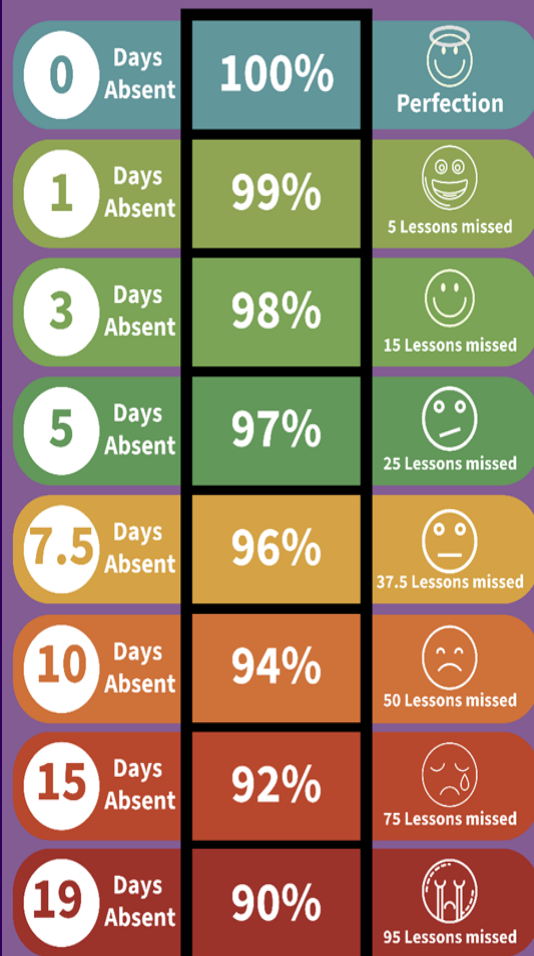
- Weekly rewards for the Form with the highest attendance in the Year group;

The Academy uses ClassCharts to record all independent learning tasks. All students and parents / carers have an individual log in for ClassCharts. If you need access, please contact your child's form tutor.

There are many different tasks that teachers may set students to complete independently such as completing research, undertaking a project, revising for a topic, completing an assessment, reviewing and / or improving a task and completing some online activities.

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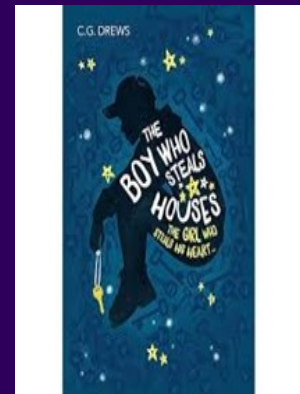
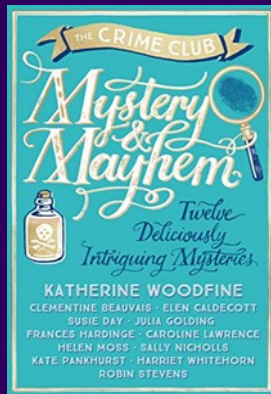
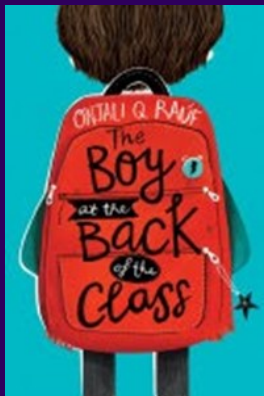


Year 7 Readathon:

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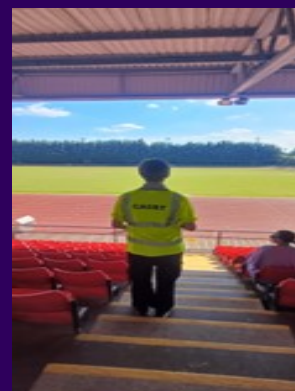
A visit to Weekley Justice Centre

We have also been keen to improve the functionality e.g. booking, problem resolution (including when students lose their keys), and the cleaning and sorting of items left in lockers by students at the end of the year. After consultation with the Trust and speaking with colleagues at other schools which have used the supplier, we have now installed new student lockers that are now available to rent.

Having a student locker can help our students to reduce carrying equipment and avoid misplacing important school items. The normal price for the hire of one of these lockers for a year is £35, however we have negotiated this price down to £25 for our students / families. - Enter the **4 digit code** detailed on your confirmation email and open the lock
- Should you forget your code it can be reissued by visiting www.locker.rentals and clicking on the re-issue my locker code link.

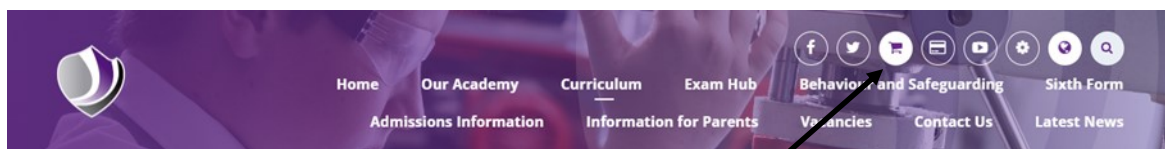

Kingswood Secondary Academy – Uniform Requirements

At Kingswood Secondary Academy we believe that wearing our distinctive uniform gives our students a sense of belonging, fosters pride in the Academy and stops students coming to school in inappropriate clothing or footwear. Students are our ambassadors in the community and therefore we expect all students to wear full uniform when travelling to and from the Academy, at all Academy functions, on extra-curricular visits and when taking part in sports events. Please refer to our website for updated uniform policy and expectations.

Our Academy uniform consists of:

- An Academy tie with a traditional white shirt which has a fastened top button and is long enough to be tucked into trousers or a skirt; the bottom of the tie should meet the waistband
- Black trousers or skirt made of standard material – studs or zips on pockets must not be visible. Jeans, cords, hipster and tight-fitting (e.g. Revs-style) trousers are not appropriate and all trousers should cover the ankle. Combat-style trousers, e.g. with additional side pockets, are not allowed. Skirts should be no shorter than knee length and should not be fitted or made of tight stretchy material. Skater-style skirts are not suitable. As a rule of thumb, trousers and skirts should be modest.
- Academy blazer for all students in years 7 to 11
- Black or grey socks with black trousers; neutral or black tights with skirts
- Black leather or leather-style traditional school shoes that can be polished, with a heel no more than 2cm in height. (No boots or trainers, or trainer-style shoes such as Vans or Converse are allowed. Girls' ballet-type footwear is not acceptable)

Physical education kit for all years:

- Black tracksuit bottoms with academy logo
- Black short-sleeved sports polo shirt with purple panels and the academy logo
- Black long-sleeved sports shirt with purple panels and the academy logo
- Black shorts with academy logo
- Suitable trainers or other sports footwear
- Sports leggings with academy logo or plain black sports leggings (not cotton) Students will also be required to bring other appropriate kit to their PE lessons where necessary. For example, shin-guards for contact sports, studded boots for rugby, mouth guard for some PE activities. Students will be given specific advice from their PE teachers.

Parking and access to Kingswood Secondary Academy:

Wherever possible we encourage our students to walk or cycle to the Academy for the obvious health and environmental benefits this brings.

If you do bring your child by car, please can you note the following:

Dropping off your child in the morning:

It would be most helpful if you could drop off your child off a few hundred metres from school and they walk the short distance in.

If you do wish to use our roundabout then we do allow this in the mornings. This works because parents drop off their children over a 30-45 minute period, so congestion does not tend to be a significant issue.

Collecting your child at the end of the day:

Due to the inevitable departure of students in a relatively short period of time at the end of a school day, it does not work for us to allow parents onto site to collect their child. This is because of the very significant congestion caused which leads to vehicles backing up out of our entrance, in turn then blocking Gainsborough Road in both directions.

In summary: please do not drive onto our school site to collect your child at the end of the day.

Exception: If your child has a disability then please speak with their Head of Year or Miss Skorwider in our Special Educational Needs Department who will make appropriate arrangements.

Sadly, we quite often get complaints from local residents e.g. on Tower Hill Road and Oak Wood Drive. With this in mind, we'd be very grateful if you note the following:

Tower Hill Road is a no stopping area between Monday - Friday 8am - 6pm and this is clearly sign posted on the road.

Please park considerately and consider parking further away and allowing your child to walk for a couple of minutes to get to you, so you can park in a less congested location.

Please avoid blocking residents' drives and do not use residents' drives to turn around in or stop in. Please avoid parking on yellow lines.
