This term, we were delighted to welcome many businesses to the academy for our annual careers fair. As you will see from the photos in this newsletter and on our website, the event created a fantastic buzz throughout the atrium. With approximately 50 companies in attendance—from local businesses to national and international organisations—the fair offered an exceptional opportunity for our students. We estimate that more than 500 people attended across the day, including Kingswood students and families from the wider Corby community.

The purpose of the event was to help students make clear connections between their day-to-day hard work and the exciting futures available to them. Feedback from visiting employers was outstanding; they described our students as the best they had met—confident, engaging and genuinely lovely. I wholeheartedly agree.

I am also delighted to share some exceptional news regarding our position within the community. This year, we received the highest number of applications ever for our Year 7 intake. With over 408 families listing Kingswood as a preference for just 216 available places—including a 25% increase in first-choice applications—we are proudly oversubscribed. We have also seen a record number of applications to our sixth form, with 130 students applying.

Additionally, attendance at our Parents' Evenings has reached a new high, with nearly 80% of families attending our recent Year 10 event. While we will always strive for even greater engagement, this strong partnership between home and the academy is central to supporting your children's success. Thank you for your continued trust, commitment and support.

Respect, Independence, Service, Empathy

Why is Enrichment so important?

Enrichment:

- Helps children develop their interests and talents;
- Enables children to develop their character, confidence and independence;
- Teaches children how to keep physically and mentally healthy;
- Prepares individuals for future success.

Students can also participate in the following:

Student council: Elected form representatives from all year groups discuss issues affecting students and the Academy. This is a working party which helps our Academy progress.

KEM – Kingswood Ethnic Minorities: Volunteers discuss issues that affect and create a more inclusive community. This raises awareness, and students help to plan our cultural celebration days.

LGBTQ+: Formed of students from all year groups. This is an open and safe group where students discuss issues affecting their community. They also raise awareness by organising events and celebration days.

Personal Development Curriculum

This spring, students across all year groups will be engaging with a rich and varied Personal Development curriculum designed to deepen their understanding of modern life, citizenship and the wider world.

Year 11 will explore *politics and parliament*, learning how the UK is governed, the roles of key national leaders, and how individuals can get involved in grassroots politics and campaigning.

Year 8 will investigate *UK law, crime and society* through an interactive “Desert Island” case study inspired by *Lord of the Flies*. Each lesson builds on the last as students develop their own rules, justice system and community responses to conflict.

Year 9 will focus on *extremism and terrorism*, examining definitions, different forms of extremism and radicalisation, and the dangers of conspiracy theories. Students will also revisit their understanding of Antisemitism, linking to their earlier Holocaust studies in History.

Year 10 will delve into *British Values*, beginning with what these values represent before examining Liberty, Mutual Tolerance and Respect. They will also explore issues such as hate crime and the rise of misinformation and fake news.

Year 11 will follow the statutory *Relationships and Sex Education (RSE)* curriculum, covering healthy and unhealthy relationships, recognising abuse, staying safe around alcohol and parties, maintaining good sexual health, and revisiting key information on contraception.

Across the term, each year group will be supported to develop lifelong skills, reflect on important social issues, and build their understanding of the responsibilities and opportunities they have as young citizens.

There are many different tasks that teachers may set students to complete independently such as completing research, undertaking a project, revising for a topic, completing an assessment, reviewing and / or improving a task and completing some online activities.

We are also looking forward to welcoming an RSC Director Mentor in April, who will lead a specialist workshop to support the development of our final piece. In the meantime, KSC rehearsals will continue during lunchtime sessions as our performance begins to take shape.

Have you noticed a decline in your own mental health, or that of a family member, over the past six to twelve months?

If so, *Street Tag* offers a fun and motivating way to turn screen time into opportunities for physical activity and wellbeing.

We are delighted to announce that **Kingswood** is taking part in **Season 1 of the Corby Schools Street Tag event**, which will officially launch on **Monday, 26 January 2026**. As a school, we have entered as a team with the aim of encouraging our whole community to become more active and healthier in 2026.

Street Tag is an interactive app that can be downloaded via the Street Tag website. It encourages participants of all ages — from Year 1 students to grandparents — to walk, jog, run or cycle around Corby to collect virtual tags. A step-by-step guide on how to access the game is attached. When signing up, please remember to select **Kingswood Secondary Academy** so that all activity contributes to our position on the leaderboard.

Once the app is installed, tags are automatically collected when you come within range, meaning you do not need to take your phone out while being active — the app registers your progress for you. To ensure a fair and fresh start for all schools, the leaderboard will be **reset to zero at 7:00 a.m. on Monday**, so even walking to school that morning could help kick-start our score.

Every step counts — whether you are walking, running, or cycling — and all physical activity helps boost our school's position on the leaderboard. Steps recorded from both indoor and outdoor activities can also be converted into Street Tag points via the app using Fitbit, Apple Watch, Garmin, an in-built phone pedometer, or by uploading screenshots of step counts.

New student lockers

We have recently installed new student lockers, which are now available to rent. These lockers offer a modern, robust, and secure solution for storing student belongings and equipment. Having a locker can help students reduce the amount they carry each day and avoid misplacing important school items.

The standard rental price for a locker is £35 per year, but we have negotiated a reduced rate of £25 for our students and their families.

Additionally, if students left any items in their lockers last academic year, we kindly ask them to visit Student Services during breaktimes or after school. All items have been bagged separately, and students will need to provide their old locker number to collect their belongings. Unclaimed items after two weeks will be disposed of — e.g. donated to charity shops or recycled.

Annual Lockdown Drill:

The safety and welfare of our students and staff is our highest priority at Kingswood. As you would expect, we regularly practise emergency drills to ensure our staff and students know what to do in an emergency. The aims of the training drills are to improve our ability to protect pupils/students, save lives, and reduce injuries. These practice drills allow us to evaluate our emergency operation plans and improve our response skills.

For many years now we have also practised our 'Lockdown Drill' and we wanted to make you aware of this. These drills are designed to ensure that pupils/students are aware of our safety procedures and to reduce the level of anxiety that could come from a real-life situation should it ever occur - which of course, we hope never will.

A lockdown would be initiated when a situation arises that requires the isolation (rather than evacuation) of students and staff from an identified risk, such as; dangerous animal in the vicinity of the school, local emergency (gas cloud/air pollution), or an intruder on our site.

In the event of a real risk and lockdown, we would initiate lockdown in liaison with the police. Parents and carers will be contacted at a suitable time to inform them of the event. It is vital that parent(s)/carer(s) do not:

- Contact the school via telephone in order to keep our phone lines clear
- Contact your child/children directly by mobile phone even if they contact you
- Come to school in person, unless told it is safe to do so by ourselves

We appreciate that this would be extremely difficult, but if the above points are not followed this could jeopardise the safety of students and staff in school.

Please be sure that your contact information is up to date and accurate. It is a good idea to have several trusted adults listed as contacts with the school.

We must stress that these incidents are extremely unlikely to occur. However, we are best to be prepared and because of our lockdown planning we did successfully initiate a lockdown on the advice of the Police in 2022 when stray dogs were in the local community.

Parking and Access to Kingswood Secondary Academy

Wherever possible, we encourage our students to walk or cycle to the Academy, as this offers clear health and environmental benefits.

If you do bring your child by car, please note the following:

Dropping Off Your Child in the Morning

It would be most helpful if you could drop off your child a few hundred metres from the school and allow them to walk the short distance in.

If you wish to use our roundabout, this is permitted in the mornings. This works well because drop-offs occur over a 30–45-minute period, so congestion is generally not a significant issue.

Collecting Your Child at the End of the Day

Due to the large number of students leaving in a short time frame, we do not allow parents onto the site to collect their children. This is because of the significant congestion it causes, which leads to vehicles backing up onto Gainsborough Road and blocking traffic in both directions.

In summary:

Please do not drive onto the school site to collect your child at the end of the day.

Exception:

If your child has a disability, please speak with their Head of Year or Miss Skorwider in our Special Educational Needs Department, who will make appropriate arrangements.

Consideration for Local Residents

We often receive complaints from local residents, particularly on Tower Hill Road and Oak Wood Drive. With this in mind, we kindly ask that you:

- Note that **Tower Hill Road is a no-stopping area** between Monday and Friday, 8am–6pm. This is clearly signposted.
- Park considerately. Consider parking further away and allowing your child to walk a few minutes to meet you, helping reduce congestion.
- Avoid blocking residents' driveways or using them to turn around or stop.
- Do not park on yellow lines.

The AA - School Safety Alert

- Over **6,000 children under 16** were injured on UK roads in 2023 while walking or cycling.

The AA - Safety Advice for Drivers

- Slow down in school zones—even if not signposted.
- Avoid distractions, especially mobile phone use.
- Park responsibly—not near school gates or on zigzag lines.
- Watch out for children on bikes, scooters, or crossing roads.
- Obey school crossing patrols.

Kingswood Secondary Academy – Uniform Requirements

At Kingswood Secondary Academy we believe that wearing our distinctive uniform gives our students a sense of belonging, fosters pride in the Academy and stops students coming to school in inappropriate clothing or footwear. Students are our ambassadors in the community and therefore we expect all students to wear full uniform when travelling to and from the Academy, at all Academy functions, on extra-curricular visits and when taking part in sports events. Please refer to our website for updated uniform policy and expectations.

Our Academy uniform consists of:

- An Academy tie with a traditional white shirt which has a fastened top button and is long enough to be tucked into trousers or a skirt; the bottom of the tie should meet the waistband.
- Black trousers or skirt made of standard material (see below) – studs or zips on pockets must not be visible. Jeans, cords, hipster and tight-fitting (e.g. Revs-style) trousers are not appropriate, and all trousers should cover the ankle. Combat-style trousers, e.g. with additional side pockets, are not allowed.
- We introduced a **new skirt** in September 2025, and it is available for purchase from **Price and Buckland**, (our uniform supplier). Any student who chooses to wear a skirt must wear this approved style purchased from Price and Buckland. Students who prefer not to wear a skirt may continue to wear **tailored black trousers**, which should meet the guidelines outlined in our current uniform policy.
- Academy blazer for all students in years 7 to 11.
- Black or grey socks with black trousers; neutral or black tights with skirts.
- Black leather or leather-style traditional school shoes that can be polished, with a heel no more than 2cm in height. (No boots or trainers, or trainer-style shoes such as Vans or Converse are allowed. Girls' ballet-type footwear is not acceptable)

Physical Education kit for all years:

- Black tracksuit bottoms with Academy logo
- Black short-sleeved sports polo shirt with purple panels and the Academy logo
- Black long-sleeved sports shirt with purple panels and the Academy logo
- Black shorts with Academy logo
- Suitable trainers or other sports footwear
- Sports leggings with academy logo or plain black sports leggings (not cotton) Students will also be required to bring other appropriate kit to their PE lessons where necessary. For example, shin-guards for contact sports, studded boots for rugby, mouth guard for some PE activities. Students will be given specific advice from their PE teachers.
