1 Matters Arising

- On line payments: Parents of Year 9 pupils have been using the system for the last few weeks. After sorting out a few initial problems, Years 7, 8, 10 and 12 have now been provided with registration details. SJ explained that only one parent can register a sQuid account with a second parent being able to top up the account using a bank transfer or by using PayPoint. sQuid will provide the necessary sort code, account number and reference number for parents wishing to pay this way. It was felt that there needs to be more clarity. SJ to enquire again.

3 Any other business

Year Groups: JL explained the changes to the Year Groups for the next academic year, which will create two broadly mixed half year groups, within which Heads of Faculties are able to set students or create mixed ability teaching groups. This will make it easier to move pupils half year groups where needed. In the future, the most likely scenario is that KS3 will reduce to



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Years 7 and 8, with GCSE work starting in Year 9. It is intended for Option choices to be made in Year 8. Pupils will remain in half year groups for Core subjects with mixed ability groups in Option subjects. The current Year 10 will remain unchanged. It was felt that pupils may worry about lesson disruption using this system, however, the Academy has a zero tolerance on poor behaviour, with pupils being excluded if necessary.

Tour of the Academy: JL gave the Forum members a short tour of the Academy. This proved productive as the members could appreciate the benefits of the changes to the Dance Studio, Atrium and Mezzanine areas.
