Dear Colleagues,

Lincoln College, Oxford, are excited to share we are running our Digital Study Days, to take place in July 2021, and applications are open.

Prospective applicants in the Year 12 cohort from selected schools, including your own, can apply for one of our two streams.

The programme is designed to support students from non-traditional Oxbridge backgrounds who are also on track to do well and potentially make an application to a selective university. They should have an interest in a relevant subject area of the Humanities, and the course is particularly suited to those interested in History, English, Modern Languages, Ancient History and Archaeology.

It will take place in evening sessions between 12 July and 20 July.

The programme is designed and delivered by academics and staff at Lincoln College, Oxford with great opportunities for your students to engage with Tutors and current students.

The purpose of the programme is to support the following:

- To find out more about academic subjects of interest and life at Oxford
- To support the development of relevant academic skills (e.g. essay planning, tutorial participation, critical thinking)
- To be in an enhanced position to make a competitive application to Oxford

At the end of the programme participants will have undergone a week of the Oxford experience and have a tangible piece of work to take away with them.

Physics and Engineering at Magdalen is a brand new online programme designed specifically for Year 12 students from backgrounds that have historically been under-represented at the University of Oxford.

The aim of this intensive three-day workshop is to introduce prospective students to our Physics and Engineering Science undergraduate degrees. Through live interactive sessions — including taster lectures, practical activities, and an admissions workshop — we aim to answer your questions about the content and structure of our degree courses, and help to familiarise you with Oxford's approach to teaching and learning. OxLAT Oxford Latin Teaching Scheme

The Faculty of Classics is delighted to be able to open applications for the 2021-2023 OxLAT Latin Teaching Scheme.

The OxLAT Scheme is for enthusiastic and committed students in Years 8 and 9 (who will be going into Years 9 and 10 in September 2021) who are interested in studying for a GCSE in Latin but attend state schools where there is no Latin provision.

The Scheme offers eligible students free tuition in Latin language and literature ab initio through to GCSE examination.

Weekly two-hour lessons take place every Saturday morning during school term-time here at the Faculty (66 St Giles, Oxford) and are taught by two professional Latin instructors from the Faculty of Classics: they will start in September 2021 and continue for two years until the summer of 2023 when students will sit their Latin GCSE exams.

The academic programme of the scheme replicates the teaching students would experience were they taking the subject as a GCSE option at school (albeit in a

reduced timetable and with greater focus on independent learning): students will be expected to consolidate their classroom learning with appropriate study-time at home each week, aided by the Scheme's VLE system. Homework will be roughly the same as one would expect for any GCSE subject.

As this is an intensive course, interested students should discuss their potential participation with a parent/carer to ensure that they appreciate the level of participation and work-load expected of them and are prepared to commit to study this subject intensively over the course of two years.
