<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To introduce a list, quote, title or definition</li> </ul> <p><b>Example:</b> He brought the groceries: bread, milk and eggs. His words echoed in my head: "Do unto others only good!"</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Used to add extra information</li> </ul> <p><b>Example:</b> Sally (my older sister) lives in New York.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Shows direct speech or quotes</li> </ul> <p><b>Example:</b> "What time is it?" asked Molly</p>
