### Keywords

<b>Agnostic</b>	A person who is unsure about God's existence and what to believe.
<b>Atheist</b>	A person who disbelieves or lacks belief in the existence of God.
<b>Diversity</b>	Accepting and appreciating differences, i.e., different religions.
<b>Equality</b>	The state of being equal/ treating everyone fairly.
<b>Identity</b>	Our sense of who we are as individuals and as members of social groups.
<b>Integration</b>	The process of combining two or more things so that they work together.
<b>Multicultural</b>	Several cultures or ethnicities living in a society.
<b>Multi-faith</b>	Lots of different faiths coexisting in a society.
<b>Theist</b>	A person who believes in the existence of a God.
