The award entry showcased a variety of our initiatives and impressive academic outcomes that highlight our commitment to excellence, including:

- Addressing financial barriers with initiatives like a summer Uniform Swap Shop which benefited 60 families.

## Our Academy Cadets

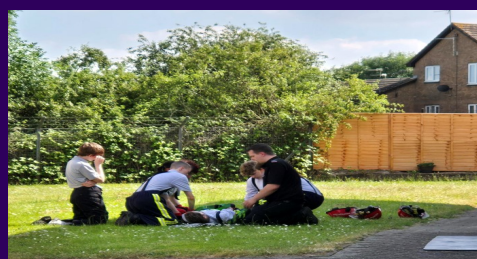

A slightly more tired start on day two but with purpose off they went again. With a good dose of cheerleading from the Kingswood staff, our teams worked very well together and finally made it to the end of their Bronze expedition!

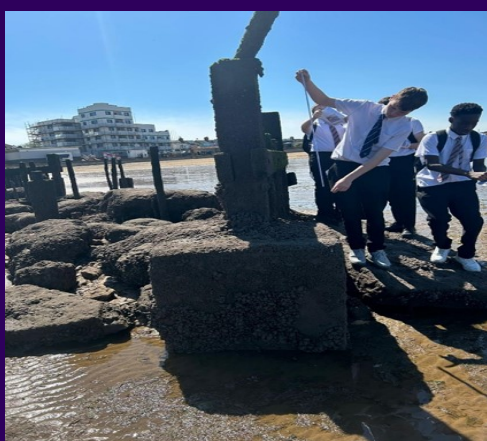

## Year 10 Geography fieldwork visit to Hunstanton

On Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> June, 75 Year 10 and 4 Year 12 students arrived in Hunstanton to conduct their fieldwork. For the morning we avoided the tide and measured the height of sand on the beach, enjoying the sunshine and investigating how well the wooden groynes work. We looked at the sea wall and asked people in the town what they thought was the most effective sea defence for the town. We even managed to see the rescue of a young seal from the beach. Students gained confidence in speaking to people they did not know and exploring the physical features of the area with its striking Hunstanton red rock and Carstone wave-cut platform which we then drew, many students revealing stunning art skills. Watching students leaping from rock to rock and balancing on the wave cut platform was just the perfect way to spend a morning.



After a lunch of fish and chips, an ice cream or two and a trip to the fair or arcade, we walked up into town to investigate the types of shop and facilities available within the town. We stopped to conduct a car survey using registration numbers to determine how many people in the town were tourists and how many were locals. Many students were surprised at how modern the town was in contrast to many shops that had closed.

Students behaved in the most amazing way they could, representing our school in the best possible manner; we couldn't have been more proud. Well done and thank you to Miss Grace for organising such a fun and productive day for us all.

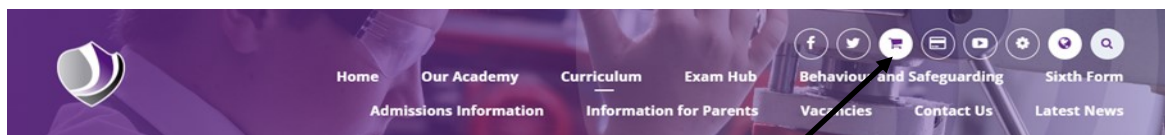

## **Parking and access to Kingswood Secondary Academy:**

Wherever possible we encourage our students to walk or cycle to the Academy for the obvious health and environmental benefits this brings.

If you do bring your child by car, please can you note the following:

### **Dropping off your child in the morning:**

It would be most helpful if you could drop off your child off a few hundred metres from school and they walk the short distance in.

If you do wish to use our roundabout then we do allow this in the mornings. This works because parents drop off their children over a 30-45 minute period, so congestion does not tend to be a significant issue.

### **Collecting your child at the end of the day:**

Due to the inevitable departure of students in a relatively short period of time at the end of a school day, it does not work for us to allow parents onto site to collect their child. This is because of the very significant congestion caused which leads to vehicles backing up out of our entrance, in turn then blocking Gainsborough Road in both directions.

**In summary: please do not drive onto our school site to collect your child at the end of the day.**

**Exception:** If your child has a disability then please speak with their Head of Year or Miss Skorwider in our Special Educational Needs Department who will make appropriate arrangements.

Sadly, we quite often get complaints from local residents e.g. on Tower Hill Road and Oak Wood Drive. With this in mind, we'd be very grateful if you note the following:

Please park considerately and consider parking further away and allowing your child to walk for a couple of minutes to get to you, so you can park in a less congested location.

Please avoid blocking residents' drives and do not use residents' drives to turn around in or stop in. Please avoid parking on yellow lines.

## **Contact details**

## New student lockers

Our current lockers have come to the end of their life cycle and we have been working on providing a more modern, robust and secure solution. We have also been keen to improve the functionality e.g. booking, problem resolution (including when students lose their keys), and the cleaning and sorting of items left in lockers by students at the end of the year. After consultation with the Trust and speaking with colleagues at other schools which have used the supplier, we have agreed that new student lockers will be installed during the summer break and will be ready to rent in September.

Having a student locker can help our students to reduce carrying equipment and avoid misplacing important school items. Rental prices start from just 12p per day. Please read the flyer below for more information about how the new system will work:

## Kingswood Secondary Academy – Uniform Requirements

At Kingswood Secondary Academy we believe that wearing our distinctive uniform gives our students a sense of belonging, fosters pride in the Academy and stops students coming to school in inappropriate clothing or footwear. Students are our ambassadors in the community and therefore we expect all students to wear full uniform when travelling to and from the Academy, at all Academy functions, on extra-curricular visits and when taking part in sports events. Please refer to our website for updated uniform policy and expectations.

Our Academy uniform consists of:

- An Academy tie with a traditional white shirt which has a fastened top button and is long enough to be tucked into trousers or a skirt; the bottom of the tie should meet the waistband
- Black trousers or skirt made of standard material – studs or zips on pockets must not be visible. Jeans, cords, hipster and tight-fitting (e.g. Revs-style) trousers are not appropriate and all trousers should cover the ankle. Combat-style trousers, e.g. with additional side pockets, are not allowed. Skirts should be no shorter than knee length and should not be fitted or made of tight stretchy material. Skater-style skirts are not suitable. As a rule of thumb, trousers and skirts should be modest.
- Academy blazer for all students in years 7 to 11
- Black or grey socks with black trousers; neutral or black tights with skirts
- Black leather or leather-style traditional school shoes that can be polished, with a heel no more than 2cm in height. (No boots or trainers, or trainer-style shoes such as Vans or Converse are allowed. Girls' ballet-type footwear is not acceptable)

Physical education kit for all years:

- Black tracksuit bottoms with academy logo
- Black short-sleeved sports polo shirt with purple panels and the academy logo
- Black long-sleeved sports shirt with purple panels and the academy logo
- Black shorts with academy logo
- Suitable trainers or other sports footwear
- Sports leggings with academy logo or plain black sports leggings (not cotton) Students will also be required to bring other appropriate kit to their PE lessons where necessary. For example, shin-guards for contact sports, studded boots for rugby, mouth guard for some PE activities. Students will be given specific advice from their PE teachers.
