## Message from our Principal:

Wow! Time really does fly. I can't believe we are heading into the summer term already. This term has been full of positivity at Kingswood. At the start of the term, we surveyed our students and teachers to establish their opinions of the new rewards system and relaunched our behaviour policy. The results backed up what our own analysis has shown: that Kingswood is an academy where students learn well and that our students and teachers feel we have further improved. Some of the key headlines from the survey are:

77% of staff feel students were more engaged in lessons;

66% of students feel there has been an overall improvement in the learning behaviour of students in the classroom;

85% of staff feel students are more likely to be equipped ready for the lesson and learning;

78% of students feel good for getting rewarded, and feel this has made Kingswood better.

Kingswood is a fabulous place to work and a wonderful place to learn. As ever, we continue to look for opportunities to improve and provide our students with the very best chances of reaching their full potential and becoming successful citizens of the future. This remains our core vision and I have enjoyed visiting assemblies this week to further discuss this vision with our students.

I have been so impressed with our students who are preparing diligently for their GCSE and A-Level exams. Their conduct has been fabulous, and I know the staff are all working particularly hard to support them in these key weeks. Good luck all.

### Personal development:

During Term 5 we had a variety of activities, ranging from our Cadets supporting the County Athletics Championships to our KS4 and KS5 students sitting some of their GCSE and A Level examinations. We wish them well as the examinations continue in Term 6.

We hosted assemblies on Protected Characteristics and PSCO Steve Coles discussed issues that affect our young people in the community. On May 17<sup>th</sup> our Year 9 students participated in The County Schools Challenge in which the whole year group were given an issue that impacts our community and they suggested and presented ideas on how the issue could be addressed and highlighted.

In Term 6 we have our cultural and diversity month in June with PRIDE celebrations which are taking place in Corby on June 22nd. In PSHE we will focus on the Jigsaw 'Changing Me' module which explores the Relationships and Sex Education topics. ## Berlin Easter 2024

Year 10 and Year 11 students visited Berlin over the Easter break. This four-day trip focused on Weimar and Nazi Germany. Students completed a walking tour of Berlin on the first day. We walked 26,000 steps, taking in the sights of Berlin and visiting the Memorial to the Murdered Jews of Europe, Checkpoint Charlie, The Resistance Museum and in the evening a tour of the Reichstag. Day two took us to Sachsenhausen which was a Concentration Camp outside Berlin. Here students learnt how political prisoners were treated by the Nazis. We then completed a tour of the 1936 Olympic Stadium. This is also the home ground of Herthe Berlin. We rounded off the day with Bowling. The final day saw us visit the remains of the Berlin Wall and the East Side Gallery. The trip was excellent, and students were thoroughly exhausted at the end which wasn't helped by our cancelled return flight and a night spent at Brandenburg Airport! Students all took this in good part, some enjoying a game of football with a pair of socks and others playing Uno and some having a much needed snooze.



ParentPay is a convenient facility that enables parents and carers to pay, in a cashless way, for various items. ## **Parking and access to Kingswood Secondary Academy:**

Wherever possible we encourage our students to walk or cycle to the Academy for the obvious health and environmental benefits this brings.

If you do bring your child by car, please can you note the following:

### **Dropping off your child in the morning:**

It would be most helpful if you could drop off your child off a few hundred metres from school and they walk the short distance in.

If you do wish to use our roundabout then we do allow this in the mornings. This works because parents drop off their children over a 30-45 minute period, so congestion does not tend to be a significant issue.

### **Collecting your child at the end of the day:**

Due to the inevitable departure of students in a relatively short period of time at the end of a school day, it does not work for us to allow parents onto site to collect their child. This is because of the very significant congestion caused which leads to vehicles backing up out of our entrance, in turn then blocking Gainsborough Road in both directions.

**In summary: please do not drive onto our school site to collect your child at the end of the day.**

**Exception:** If your child has a disability then please speak with their Head of Year or Miss Skorwider in our Special Educational Needs Department who will make appropriate arrangements.

Sadly, we quite often get complaints from local residents e.g. on Tower Hill Road and Oak Wood Drive. With this in mind, we'd be very grateful if you note the following:

Please park considerately and consider parking further away and allowing your child to walk for a couple of minutes to get to you, so you can park in a less congested location.

Please avoid blocking residents' drives and do not use residents' drives to turn around in or stop in. Please avoid parking on yellow lines.

Thank you for your understanding.

## Kingswood Secondary Academy – Uniform Requirements

At Kingswood Secondary Academy we believe that wearing our distinctive uniform gives our students a sense of belonging, fosters pride in the Academy and stops students coming to school in inappropriate clothing or footwear. Students are our ambassadors in the community and therefore we expect all students to wear full uniform when travelling to and from the Academy, at all Academy functions, on extra-curricular visits and when taking part in sports events. Please refer to our website for updated uniform policy and expectations.

Our Academy uniform consists of:

- An Academy tie with a traditional white shirt which has a fastened top button and is long enough to be tucked into trousers or a skirt; the bottom of the tie should meet the waistband
- Black trousers or skirt made of standard material – studs or zips on pockets must not be visible. Jeans, cords, hipster and tight-fitting (e.g. Revs-style) trousers are not appropriate and all trousers should cover the ankle. Combat-style trousers, e.g. with additional side pockets, are not allowed. Skirts should be no shorter than knee length and should not be fitted or made of tight stretchy material. Skater-style skirts are not suitable. As a rule of thumb, trousers and skirts should be modest.
- Academy blazer for all students in years 7 to 11
- Black or grey socks with black trousers; neutral or black tights with skirts
- Black leather or leather-style traditional school shoes that can be polished, with a heel no more than 2cm in height. (No boots or trainers, or trainer-style shoes such as Vans or Converse are allowed. Girls' ballet-type footwear is not acceptable)

Physical education kit for all years:

- Black tracksuit bottoms with academy logo
- Black short-sleeved sports polo shirt with purple panels and the academy logo
- Black long-sleeved sports shirt with purple panels and the academy logo
- Black shorts with academy logo
- Suitable trainers or other sports footwear
- Sports leggings with academy logo or plain black sports leggings (not cotton) Students will also be required to bring other appropriate kit to their PE lessons where necessary. For example, shin-guards for contact sports, studded boots for rugby, mouth guard for some PE activities. Students will be given specific advice from their PE teachers.
