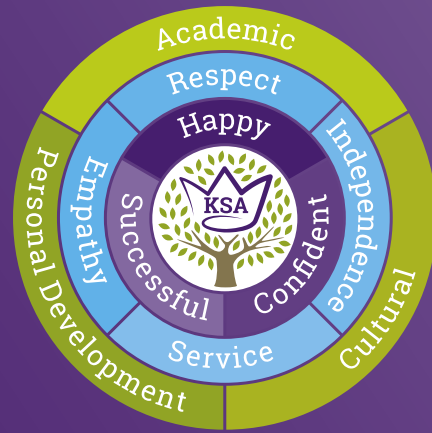

The Academy Curriculum

All pupils at the Kingswood Secondary Academy have access to a broad and balanced curriculum. The Academy has a comprehensive intake, taking pupils of all abilities.

We use a combination of mixed ability teaching and setting, depending on age and curriculum area. We believe this gives pupils the best experience, working at the pace necessary to give them the highest possible standard of education. This approach also allows us to challenge and support appropriately.

In years 7, 8 and 9 almost all pupils will study English, mathematics, science, geography, history, religious education, at least one modern foreign language (French or Spanish), IT, technology (textiles, food technology, financial education and first aid), expressive arts (music, drama, dance), art and physical education.

In years 10 and 11 pupils study a core curriculum of English, mathematics, science and physical education. In addition to this core curriculum pupils choose three further courses that they wish to pursue in depth, typically including GCSEs and high-quality vocational subjects.

In the sixth form we offer a wide range of A-level and high-quality level 3 vocational courses.

During form time, a comprehensive Pastoral Curriculum covering all aspects of PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education) and citizenship is delivered for pupils in each year group.

Our Facilities

In September 2010, we moved into our state-of-the-art new building. This means pupils at Kingswood Secondary Academy can take advantage of facilities such as innovatively designed ICT suites, purpose built suites for Technology and Science, as well as facilities of the highest quality for sports and the arts.

The provision for the arts is equal to those found in many small commercial theatres: a large performance area and a drama suite. The performance area is fitted out with commercial lighting and retractable tiered seating to allow it to function as a theatre.

Our sports facilities include an all-weather floodlit training surface, with three separate areas marked out for football, rugby training and hockey. We also have a large hard surfaced multi-use games area (MUGA), a huge sports hall offering virtually every facility available and a multi-gym, fitted with cardiovascular machines.

Lunchtimes

Pupils in years 7 to 11 are expected to stay on the Academy site at lunchtime. We will ensure they are safe and have access to a healthy and nutritious meal. Lunchtime clubs and activities are also run for pupils to opt into.

The Care of Pupils

The welfare of our pupils is very important to us. We want our pupils to enjoy coming to the Academy, to feel safe and to be successful.

We believe the most effective pastoral model is year based. Led by Heads of Year, our year teams have a non-teaching Deputy Head of Year and a team of tutors.

With year offices in the heart of the teaching environment, our pastoral leaders are able to respond rapidly to individual pupil needs. We are determined to work closely with parents to resolve any pupil issues that may arise, quickly and effectively.

Each pupil is placed in an appropriate tutor group. Each of these groups is in the charge of a form tutor, who plays a major role in supporting each child in the group. The form tutor is the first point of contact for parents. During form time pupils follow our comprehensive Pastoral Curriculum which includes the Jigsaw PSHE spiral program, Votes for School, literacy, citizenship and British Values lessons along with assemblies and themed weeks and activities.

It is the responsibility of the Head of Year to co-ordinate and support the work of the form tutors and to oversee the academic and social progress of the year as a whole.

Learning Support

At the Kingswood Secondary Academy, all staff share the responsibility for identifying and assessing pupils 'needs and for putting into practice schemes of work which meet the full range of pupils 'abilities and needs.

We have an educational support department, comprising full-time specialist teachers and a large team of Learning Assistants (LAs). In addition, we have Higher Level Learning Assistants (HLLAs) who work with different departments; some of our LAs are trained as Behaviour Support Assistants and others are trained as Learning Mentors.

We also have a Designated Special Provision (DSP) for pupils who have an Education and Health Care Plan where the primary diagnosis is for autism. We continue to develop links with the relevant outside agencies which provide specialist help and advice.

Our educational support department ensures pupils follow the same curriculum as others in their year group wherever possible and provides specific support for certain pupils during GCSEs and other public examinations.

Admissions Criteria

We want our Academy to serve local children and our admissions criteria are published in full on our Academy website at www.kingswoodsecondaryacademy.org

When the Kingswood Secondary Academy is oversubscribed, after the admission of pupils with statements of special educational needs or an education health and care plan naming the Academy, priority for admission will be given to those children who meet the criteria set out below, in priority order:

a) Looked after children and previously looked after children including those children who appear to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted*.

b) Children who live in Cottingham, Middleton, Rockingham and East Carlton – for whom the local education authority provides transport to the Kingswood Secondary Academy.

c) Children who will have an older sibling* continuing at the Kingswood Secondary Academy at the time of admission of the younger child.

d) Children of members of staff, provided that they have been employed for a minimum of two years and/or are recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skills shortage.

e) Children who live closer to the Kingswood Secondary Academy than any other school*.

f) Other children.

In the event of over-subscription using the above criteria, priority will be given to children on the basis of proximity to the Academy, as measured in a straight line from the child's home to the address point of the Academy.

Admissions to the Academy

1. Pupils are admitted at the start of, and during, two main stages:
 - secondary Year 7 (age 11)
 - secondary Sixth Form (age 16)

For admission to Year 7, in the year preceding admission, parents should apply on-line or on paper using the Northamptonshire County Council Local Authority Schools Admissions process.

2. For admission in September 2024, these forms can be accessed on-line from 13 September 2023 and all forms should be returned to Northamptonshire County Council Local Authority.

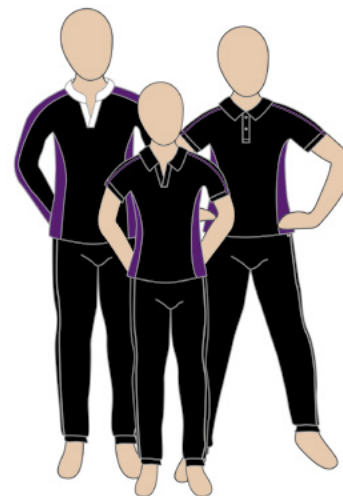
The Academy Uniform

At the Kingswood Secondary Academy we enforce our strict uniform policy rigorously. We believe that wearing our distinctive uniform gives our pupils a sense of belonging, helps foster pride in the Academy and stops pupils coming to school in inappropriate clothing or footwear. Pupils are our ambassadors in the community. Therefore, we expect all pupils to wear full uniform when travelling to and from the Academy, at all Academy functions, on extra-curricular visits and when taking part in sports events.

Our Academy uniform consists of:

- An Academy tie with the relevant year group coloured stripe with a traditional white shirt or blouse which has a fastened top button and is long enough to be tucked into trousers or a skirt; the bottom of the tie should meet the waistband. The tie should be long enough to meet the waistband of the trousers or skirt.
- Black trousers or skirt made of standard material. Trousers should be to the ankle and skirts should sit below the knee.
- **From September 2021 black blazers with the Academy logo/badge are compulsory for pupils in Years 7 to 11.**
- An (optional) Academy v neck pullover or cardigan, in purple (years 7-8) or black (years 9-11), with the Academy logo.
- Black or grey socks with black trousers, neutral or black tights with skirts.
- Black leather or leather-style traditional school shoes that can be polished with a heel no more than 2cm in height.
- **From September 2020, Student card, badge holder and lanyards are compulsory for all students. These are provided initially by the school but any that are lost or damaged must be replaced and paid for via the ParentPay Shop.**

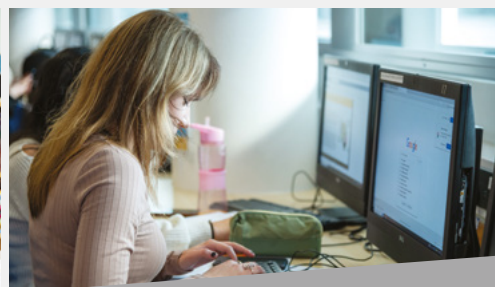

The Academy Day

Each day is divided into five different teaching sessions and one tutorial session. This one week timetable, consisting of five 60 minute lessons, allows for greater timetabling flexibility and curriculum delivery. For example, this allows us to have less pupil movements around the Academy during the day and provide for longer, more immersive learning, especially, but not exclusively, in practical subjects.

Rewards and Expectations

We have high expectations of all members of our Academy community. We are proud of our achievements and even more excited about the future. Our values are clear and we expect all members of the Academy community to live by them, both inside the building and as Ambassadors when they are away from the Academy grounds.

We have high expectations about uniform, behaviour and effort and this is because we take our responsibility seriously to develop successful citizens of the future. As you would expect, excessive jewellery, nail varnish, make up and trainers are not permitted in our Academy. Hair is to be of a natural colour and extreme cuts, including shaved designs, are not acceptable.

Decisions on all aspects of our Academy expectations are the responsibility of the Principal and his decision is final.

Recognising both effort and attainment are important aspects of our Academy. We strongly believe that if pupils are recognised and celebrated for their commitment to all aspects of Academy life they will achieve even higher levels of performance. Our positive culture encourages all pupils to work to their limits and we are delighted to then reward them accordingly. Our recognition system is based around RISE points which are awarded by all members of Academy staff for great effort, and demonstrating consistent RISE Values (Respect, Independence, Service and Empathy). Additionally, the Academy awards silver and gold ties and badges for outstanding student contributions in subject areas, clubs, community activities and excellent attendance.

We run celebration assemblies on a regular basis, where individual and team efforts are recognised, in addition to more formal Celebration Evenings where members of the family are invited to share the positive experience.



We have a number of Academy Ambassador roles; these are important leadership posts which influence how we continually improve and run our Academy. These include Student Council, Head Boy and Head Girl in addition to school ambassadors such as our Prefect Program. We also have our Student voice, Kingswood Ethnic Minorities, LBGTO+ groups which enable pupils to develop real leadership and communication skills that have an influence over how our Academy is run.

In summary, we firmly believe in the concept of positive recognition of great performance and we are absolutely delighted to reward pupils who go the extra mile every day in every aspect of their Academy life.

Personal Development in Kingswood

The aim of the Personal Development (PD) curriculum is to provide our young people with the knowledge and skills to embrace the exciting opportunities this modern world brings, and to deal effectively with the challenges and risks they may encounter. We want our pupils to clearly understand how to keep themselves (and others) safe and healthy (online and offline), to be accepting of diversity, to show empathy and kindness, and to make a positive contribution to their school, local, and wider communities.

Along with the our school lunch time and after school clubs, we offer DofE, theatre trips, guest speakers and workshops, charity and community work, Emergency Cadets, National Citizenship, careers advice and experiences.



The Organisation of our Pupils

The Academy is organised with pupils in their own year groups. This enables an effective age appropriate personal, social and health education programme and allows us to make targeted provision and interventions around progress and age-related Academy processes.

Each year group has a Head of Year and Deputy Head of Year who have overall responsibility for the welfare and development of the pupils in their year group. On a day to day basis Form Tutors fulfil this very important role.

Sixth Form

We recognise that older pupils have different needs and we are keen to help them develop into independent young people and learners. To this end we have a sixth form study centre which is designed exclusively for their use.

The Kingswood Secondary Academy Advisory Council

Each Academy within the Greenwood Academies Trust has its own Advisory Council (AAC) that works closely with each Principal.

Each AAC is a small group and has staff, parent and local community representation. It is not, however, the same as a traditional governing body as it has no legal responsibilities. All legal responsibilities are held by the GAT Trust Board.

The AAC meets formally at least termly and AAC members are encouraged to play an active part in the day-to-day life of the Academy.

The Kingswood Secondary Academy Advisory Council has three key roles in terms of the development and success of the Academy:

1. To advise and act as a critical friend to the Principal of the Academy and to advise the Trust Board about local issues they need to consider that affect the Academy
2. To represent the interests of the Academy community in the running of the Academy and to represent the Academy in its community
3. To provide support to the Principal in undertaking appropriate day-to-day procedures that are essential to the life of the Academy, such as disciplinary and complaints procedures
